Dr. Maynard also completed three years of service at Pine Ridge Indian Hospital in South Dakota as a general pediatrician before pursuing his fellowship training. He is board-certified by the American Academy of Pediatrics in general pediatrics, pediatric pulmonology and neonatology. Dr. Maynard is active with numerous professional societies and associations, including SKIP (Sick Kids Need Involved People), as Medical Director at a Camp for Technologically Dependent Children, SKIP (Minnesota), and is a member of the Minnesota Medical Association.
